### **Summer Retreat -- New Location**

The Summer Quilt Retreat will be held Friday - Sunday, June 28 - 30, 2013, at Deep Woods Retreat Center in Smithville, TX. [Registration is full, and a waiting list has been established.] Cost this year is \$190.00. Also new this year, an extra day on Thursday, June 27 will be available for an additional \$65.00. A \$50.00 non-refundable deposit is required at registration.

The work area, meals and bedrooms are all in the same building. Each person will have their oven 4 foot table and 1/2 of an 8 foot table, and an adjustable chair. Electrical plugs for your personal iron if you wish and your own 4 x 8 ft design wall is included. Plus there is a large ironing surface and several ironing boards with irons as well as several cutting tables in the room. There are 6 bedrooms with 4 twin Denver mattress beds and pillows and ample storage under each bed, and shelving units and hanging racks for belongings. There is a ceiling fan in each room. Guests will need to provide their own sheets and pillow case, but towels, wash cloths and soap are provided. There are 6 bathrooms with showers (one Handicapped) and 2 powder rooms.

Meals and snacks are served in the adjoining dining room, or you may eat on the patio. There is a breakfast bar (eat when you want) and lunch and dinner are served buffet style. Meals include Friday dinner, Saturday breakfast, lunch and dinner, and Sunday brunch. There is a refrigerator for guests to store snacks and a microwave is also available.

The committee is excited to offer you these new changes. We are limited to 24 people.

### **Minutes for BBQG Meeting**

Tuesday, March 12, 2013 Location: Brazos Center

## Introduction of the Evening's Program – Susan Kelly

The program for the evening was a Giant Show and Tell. Everyone had been asked to bring their favorite quilt and tell why it was their favorite. Many beautiful quilts were shown. Some were new and received "favorite" status by being the most recently finished quilt. Many others were vintage, having been made by a mother or grandmother. Some were the first quilt that the quilter had worked on as a child. Others were made for special occasions such as weddings and there was a very special sisters quilt whose story brought tears to our eyes.

After a 10 minute break, Sherrill Johnson called the meeting to order.

**Treasurer's Report - Charlotte Simpson** gave the Treasurer's report of account activity for the past month. Current total assets are \$28,340.04 (\$15,605.11 in checking and \$12,734.93 in savings).

**February minutes** were approved as published in the Newsletter.

**2nd VP - Membership - Brenda Brown for Debbie Ginn -** 57 members signed in, 3 visitors and 2 new members

**Sunshine & Shadows – Lynn Thurston** - Sherrill reported that Lynn had mailed out 6 cards – 4 thinking of you and 2 sympathy

### **Block of the Month - Linda Winder**

17 blocks were turned in and 2 more will be brought next time. Brenda Brown won the blocks. Next month's block is Tulip Time.

**Door Prizes – Marty Fuller** - Marty thanked those who have donated door prizes including Michaele Jackson, Sue Ryan, Sue Sprott, Gloria Warren, Terry Skrabanek and Delores Rydell. Door prize winners for this month were Carol Laughlin, Sue Sprott, Marian Dierschke and Sandy Smith.

### **Committee Reports**

Arts Council -- Mary Ann Durbin - Joann Williams, Delores Rydell & Luci Smith showed the raffle quilt at Art Steps. The next one will be the first Friday in June. Bee Keeper - Kathy Ashley - Anne reported that Kathy had sent her the bee news, but she did not receive it. They are checking to see what happened.

Care Quilts – Luci Smith - Luci was not present, but Sherrill read a letter from KAMU asking for a raffle quilt. Written on the letter was the statement that "your quilts are one of our most popular auction items." Although they probably tell each donor that, it was suggested that the letter be passed on to Lynn Thurston for part of the documentation that KAMU is asking for in exchange for giving us publicity for our guilt show.

Raffle Quilt – Luci Smith - JoAnn Williams reported that the raffle quilt has been taken to First Step twice, to Go Texas, to the antique show and to Washington on the Brazos. Approximately \$1,200 has been raised to date. There are volunteers to help, but we still need a raffle quilt chair. ...continued on page 5

Only members can advertise and only sewing related items, but is there supposed to be a fee charged? Sherrill will do some checking & see what she can find out.

Retreats - Summer - Peggy Mobley & Rowena Reed - Summer retreat is full with a waiting list. Marian visited with someone who had been to a retreat at Smithville and said that it is a wonderful retreat center.

Military Squares - Marian Dierschke - Marian has some kits available for anyone wanting to make military squares.

Dallas Bus Trip - Sue Sprott - The Dallas bus trip was a success! 44 people paid and went to the show, so the trip covered all expenses & actually made a little money. Quilt Show - Debbie Schulz - Betty reported that the committee will meet again in two weeks, so there will be more to report next month. The show theme is Quilts Across Texas. Show dates are September 27-28. Everything is moving along smoothly.

1st VP Programs – Susan Kelly - Georganne Wrinkle will be coming in May. A sign-up sheet with a tentative supply list was passed around. Next month's lecture (no workshop) will be on Barn Quilts by Marilyn Watson.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

We still need a raffle quilt chairman. There are plenty of volunteers, but someone is needed to coordinate the effort, organize & schedule volunteers to sit with the quilt and keep up with the money and get it turned in to the treasurer.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Sherrill asked everyone to sign the card for Nini. She is recovering from her surgery and doing well.

Sherrill brought a copy of the latest *Home In Style* magazine with an article on Normal Reel.

We received a letter from M.D. Anderson asking for a raffle quilt to support ovarian cancer. Donated quilts will be displayed at the Houston Quilt Festival.

Debbie Ginn is working on the membership roster, and Michaele will be e-mailing it out soon.

Michaele mentioned that the Texas Quilt Museum in LaGrange has been doing a fund raiser and asked if the board would consider supporting it. [See note on p. 4.] It is open Thursday through Sunday, and the exhibits change quarterly. Check the museum website for more details. The quilt shop next door, the Quilted Skein, is open and is in our Quilt Across Texas group. According to Terry, they have a good selection of yarn.


### **Buzz from the Bees - originally for March**

### AMISH-STYLE QUILT

You are encouraged to make a block-of-the-month for the BBQG and a block for yourself. At the end of this year you will have 12 Amish-style blocks to make your own Amish-style Sampler Quilt. Amish-style quilts are made of solid color fabrics. Amish-style quilts typically feature two or three dominant colors. An inner border is added to frame the quilt; a second border (twice as wide as the first) is added. Additional borders may be added as desired. A color already in the central design of the quilt is used in at least one border. Light colors and white are rarely used in Amish-style quilts.

Kona Cotton is a good choice for Amish-style quilts.

Mitering is rare in Amish-style quilts, as is bias binding.

### BLOCK OF THE MONTH: TULIP TIME


### Cut:

- 4 2 1/2" squares of black fabric
- 4 3 3/8" squares of black fabric
- 4 4 1/2" squares of black fabric
- 4 2 1/2" squares of pink fabric
- 4 3 3/8" squares of pink fabric
- 1 4 1/2" square of pink fabric

Sew: Stitch a scant 1/4" seam

Make 8 half square triangles using the 3 3/8" squares of pink and black.

Layer a black square and a pink square (right sides together). Use a pencil and ruler to draw a diagonal line on the pink square. Stitch a scant ¼" on each side of the drawn line (see below). Rotary cut each pair of squares apart on the drawn line. Open, press toward black, trim to 2½".







1. Stitch the black 2 1/2" squares to 4 of the half-square triangles as shown in the illustration.

Press toward black.

2. Stitch the pink 2 ½" squares to 4 of the half-square triangles as shown in the illustration.

Press toward pink.

Make the corner "tulips" by stitching 1 and 2 above as shown in the illustration. When assembling the Tulip Time block, the black square must be on the outside corners. Press toward black corner squares.

You now have a basic 9-patch block to assemble. Lay out the squares as illustrated.

Stitch the corner squares to two black 4 1/2" squares.

Press toward black.

Stitch a black 4 1/2" square to each side of the pink 4 1/2" square.

Press toward black center.

Stitch the block together as illustrated. Press well.

The block should measure 12 1/2" square.

If you are the winner of the BBQG blocks, and the blocks vary in size more than ¼", add 2 to 2 ½" borders to each block and re-cut to desired size.

### **Booth Rental**

We have four booth sizes this year. All displays must be within your booth space.

5' by 10' \$ 95 15' by 10' \$235 10' by 10' \$ 150 20' by 10' \$ 275

### **Equipment**

The following describes the number of eight foot tables and folding chairs that will be provided per booth purchase. Additional tables can be purchased for \$10.00 per table. There will be two folding chairs per booth. There is one table for the 5 by 10, two tables for the 10 by 10, three tables for the 15 by 10, and four tables for the 20 by 10. Please specify if you need additional tables. Tables must be covered and you are responsible for proper table covers. Electric power is available. Bring your own extension cords. Wireless Internet is available for a charge through the Brazos Center at an additional charge.

Pipe and drape is not provided, but is available for an additional charge.

### Check-in Thursday, September 26. 2013

Check-in is from 10am to 4:30 pm on Thursday, September 26, 2013 only. There will be no set up on Friday. Check in at the back loading dock of the Brazos Center. We will direct you to your booth. Please be considerate of you fellow vendors. Please unload as efficiently as possible and move your vehicle. You MUST BE finished setting up your booth by 4:30pm.

### Check out Saturday, September 28, 2013

Do not break down your booth until the close of the show on Saturday, September 28, 2013. Again, please be considerate of your fellow vendors. Do not move your vehicle into loading area until you are fully packed and ready to load out.

### **Additional Information**

Booth sitters will be provided for exhibitors who are the sole operators of their booths. Booth sitters will watch your booth for a 20 minute lunch break. Lunch and snacks will be provided by the guild for all three days for the vendors.

Vendor name tags will be provided by the guild. These tags must be worn at all times during the show and will allow you to enter the show each day.
