On-line Registration for BBQG Quilt Show

On-line quilt registration for the 2013 show is now available on the BBQG website. Your entry forms must be received by August 13, 2013. No entry forms will be accepted after August 13, 2013. One entry per entered quilt will be required. A digital picture of your entry is required when your registration is submitted. If you have difficulty registering on-line, assistance will be available at the August guild meeting. Bring a completed worksheet and an identifiable color photograph for each entry. On the back of each photograph write the exact width and length of the quilt, your name, address and phone number. There is a \$15.00 per quilt fee for non-Bluebonnet Quilt Guild Member entries. There is a \$5.00 per quilt fee for Bluebonnet Quilt Guild Members.

There is a limit of two (2) quilts per category per person except in the traditional pieced quilt category. The traditional pieced quilt category is limited to four (4) entries per person because this category is so large. All entries must have been completed within the last three (3) years. Complete instructions are available on the website quilt show page.

Early entries may be turned in to Jane Crouse, 5537 Somerford, Bryan, Texas on Tuesday, September 24 from 9am to 2pm. Call for earlier/later times. Quilts received on September 24 will require you to sign a liability waiver for the two days Jane will be storing them. All other entries may be turned in to the intake table between 7:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, September 26, 2013. No entries will be accepted after 9:00 a.m. September 26, 2013.

Celebrating the Fourth of July in Fabric... Texas Quilt Museum debuts "America The Beautiful" exhibit



Velda Newman's Freedom is Fragile

June 28, 2013—La Grange, Texas—Just in time for Independence Day, the Texas Quilt Museum is proud to announce its next major exhibit, "America the Beautiful." It opens July 5, and **Museum hours are 10 a.m.-4 p.m. (Thursdays-Saturdays), and Noon-4 p.m. (Sundays).**

Inspired by the familiar patriotic song of the same name, the exhibit celebrates the bounty of the land and the patriotic fervor of its citizens in all three galleries this summer. It was curated by Dr. Sandra Sider, the Museum's consulting curator.

"I am especially excited about this exhibit because it really showcases an incredible body of work, as wide and varied as the topography of the country itself," says Museum co-founder Karey Bresenhan.

Co-founder Nancy O'Bryant adds "And as it contains both antique and contemporary quilts, it also serves as a history lesson of how quilting has developed and thrived along with our country."

The exhibit will feature a total of 50 quilts split into these areas:

Galleries I & III - The familiar refrain of "America the Beautiful" inspired our exhibit of more than 40 quilts celebrating America's natural beauty, as expressed in landscapes, seascapes, and floral displays.

Gallery I (Balcony) - The song's lyrics end with a verse praising "patriot dreams that see beyond the years," and we have a rousing display of red, white, and blue antique quilts from the collection of International Quilt Festival. It is highlighted by California quilt artist Velda Newman's Statue of Liberty interpretation, Lady Liberty.

Gallery II - Eight monumental quilts (including one made from feed sacks) by New Jersey artist Teresa Barkley remind us that waves of corn in America's heartland extend to the horizon. And her quilts referencing postage stamps illustrate the popular appeal of commemorative imagery.

The Texas Quilt Museum is located at 140 W. Colorado St., La Grange, Texas 78945. It opened in 2011 and is housed in two 19thcentury buildings in the Historic District of La Grange. Its restoration has won both Preservation Texas and Main Street awards. The Museum complex also includes a period Texas garden with a monumental 13' x 85' outdoor mural, Quilts...History in the Making, as its focal point.

AMISH-STYLE QUILT

You are encouraged to make a block-of-the-month for the BBQG and a block for yourself. At the end of this year you will have 12 Amish-style blocks to make your own Amish-style Sampler Quilt. Amish-style quilts are made of <u>solid color fabrics</u>. Amish-style quilts typically feature two or three dominant colors. An inner border is added to frame the quilt; a second border (twice as wide as the first) is added. Additional borders may be added as desired. A color already in the central design of the quilt is used in at least one border. Light colors and white are rarely used in Amish-style quilts.

Kona Cotton is a good choice for Amish-style quilts.

Mitering is rare in Amish-style quilts, as is bias binding.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH: OLD GREY GOOSE

AUGUST, 2013

Cut:


- 1-6 1/2" square of turquoise fabric
- 4 3 7/8" squares of turquoise fabric
- 2 4 1/4" squares of turquoise fabric
- 4 3 1/2" squares of black fabric
- 1-7 1/4" square of black fabric
- 2 41/4" squares of black fabric

Sew: Stitch a scant ¼" seam

Using the 4 1/4" squares, make four half-square triangles.



Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each 4 ¼"turquoise square. Layer a black square and a turquoise square (right sides together). Stitch a scant ¼" on each side of the drawn line (see illustration on following page). Rotary cut each pair of squares apart on the drawn line. Open, press toward black, trim to 3 ½".



Make 4 flying geese:

Align two 3 7/8" turquoise squares (A) on opposite corners of the 7 ¼" black square, right sides together. Draw a diagonal line as shown in the illustration below. Stitch ¼" each side of the line. Cut apart on the drawn line.

Open the two sides. Press toward the turquoise to form a "heart" shape.

On the remaining corner of each of these units align the remaining 3 7/8" turquoise squares.

Draw a line to the corner and stitch ¼" each side of the line. Cut on the line and press. You now have 4 flying geese.


technique

Fast Flying Geese. Align 2 B's on opposite corners of an A, right sides together. Draw a diagonal line as shown and then stitch 1/4" out from both sides of the line. Cut apart on the marked line.



Open out the B's and press the unit.

On the remaining corner of each of these units, align B's. Draw a line from corner to corner and sew 1/4" out on both sides of the line. Cut on the marked lines, open the B's and press.



Make 112

Each set of 1 A and 4 matching B's makes 4 Flying Geese.

Draw diagonal lines on each of the 3 ½" black squares. Place a 3 ½" black square on opposite corners of the 6 ½" turquoise square. Stitch on the diagonal line. Trim seam to ¼"; press toward black. Place 3 ½" black squares on the other corners; stitch, press, and trim as before.

Stitch half-square triangles to flying geese as shown: top and bottom. Press toward flying geese.

Stitch flying geese to the center square as shown. Press toward flying geese.

Assemble as indicated in the sample picture.
