


January 14, 2014 12 ½" unfinished block found In the book "the Union Quilters" By Jennifer Chiaverini.






Pattern for "campfire" as 3.000 by 3.000 (inches) block, printed from EQ7!

1 & 9--make 2- 3 1/2" half sq. triangle with bkgrd & red.
2-- 4" sq's put face to face, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Sew ¼" on each side of line. Will make
2 -- 3 ½" sq. Trim if needed.





2 & 8-- cut from bkgrd 2-2" x 6 ½ strips


And 2-2" x 3 ½" strips

From It blue cut 2 - 2" sq's.

Sew the blue to the 3 ½" strip, then sew the 6 ½" to the 3 ½" w/blue,

To make a 6 ½" x 3 ½ piece.

4 & 6 same as above only use a 2" sq of drk blue.



5 center, from bkgrd cut 2- 4" sq's . Cut diagonally once. Cut a 4 3/4" sq from the red. Sew the triangles to the sides of red sq.

To make a 6 1/2" sq.

Sew together using the grid on page 1.

Happy sewing!!!!!
