Hello Friends of Luci: Luci is going home this Thursday [5/29]!


Her daughter, Debbie, will be staying with her and Luci will have outpatient therapy. We don't know the schedule yet.

Quilt Education Activity


For the past two weeks, members and volunteers have been helping with the eighth grade math classes' quilt project at AMCMS in College Station.

All students had a pattern and instructions to follow and worked in groups of four. They took turns with measuring, cutting, sewing and pressing. A little practice and staying on task (though not easy) showed results when the 4-patch blocks came together. One student in each group will get to keep the quilt. At this writing, most are putting the layers together and are thrilled with the finished product!


Union Hall

Center sq.

From the red cut---1-3 ½" sq.

From the blue cut ---1-4 ¼" sq. Cut diagonally both way, sew the triangles to the red center piece To make a 4 ¾ sq.

From the gold & green, cut 1- 4" sq from each Cut diagonally once. Sew to the 4 3/4" blue & red sq. Sq to 6 1/2" if needed.



Cut 1 strip from red, blue 13" x2"
Cut 2 strips from bkgrd 13" x 2"sew blue, red to
The bkgrd fabric--cut each in half, making
2-6 1/2" strips.



Corner stones—from the red, cut 4--2 ½" sq. From the bkgrd cut 8--2 ½" sq. cut diagonally once. Sew to red sq on each side. Trim to 3 ½"



Sew the corner blocks to the ends of red & bkgrd strips Sew the blue & bkgrd strip to sides, then the red & bkgrd to the other sides.
