19th Annual BBQG Winter Retreat

Fall is in the air, and it's time to start thinking about winter retreat! The 19th Annual Winter Retreat will be held February 11-15, 2016 at Camp Lone Star in La Grange. If you would like to attend (and did not pre-register last spring), you may **sign up for the** winter retreat beginning at 6:30 p.m. on November 10th at the Brazos Center. The retreat is open to BBQG members only (persons who have been paidup members since January 2015). Registrants have the option of signing up for either 3 nights (Thursday, Friday and Saturday) or 4 nights (Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday). The cost of the retreat is the same as last year: \$230 for 3 nights and \$280 for 4 nights. These costs include meals and lodging. A **\$50 deposit** must be given in person to Jeanne Joham at the time of sign-up to confirm your registration. If you are unable to register in person November 10th, you may have someone who is not going to retreat complete the process for you. If more than one person from your group cannot register in person, each of them has to send a different person not going to retreat to register on her behalf. We will not accept more than one registration per person. The balance will be due by the January BBQG meeting. You may also pay for the retreat in installments, but the final payment is due January 12, 2016 – no exceptions!! Also, please remember that all participants must have paid their 2016 BBOG annual dues before making final payment for the 2016 winter retreat. All monies collected are deposited when received. Refunds will be given for emergencies per BBQG by-lays. For more information, please contact Jeanne Joham at 589-2191.
