

Minutes for Brazos Bluebonnet Quilt Guild Tuesday, January 12, 2016

Welcome: The meeting was opened at 7 p.m. by Sue Idol.

Minutes – **Michaele Jackson** made a motion to approve the November minutes, **Linda Winder** seconded, minutes approved.

Sunshine and Shadows - **Lynn Thurston** was absent; **Connie Silber** fell and cracked her knee. **Norma Reel** presented a pieced "Metro Rings" quilt top to outgoing President, **Sue Sprott**, with thanks.

Membership - Nadine Stuth reported 61 members, 3 visitors, and 7 new members - Lou Ellen Hassold, Kitty Art, Marjean Neal, Rhonda Kuboviak, Suzanne Hinson, Janet Bowman and Stephanie Modrall.

Door Prizes - Sue Ryan awarded winners, **Sharon Braunagel** and **Sherrill Johnson**.

Committee Reports:

Arts Council: Mary Anne Durbin stated we are an affiliate member and get the Arts Council's newsletter. A Judged Show 2016 will be Jan. 8-30 with an Opening Reception at the Arts Council on Jan. 7 at 6 pm. David Sites "Impressions of the Landscape" will be Jan. 22-Mar. 28 at the Kyle House in Bryan with an Opening Reception Jan. 21 at 6:30 pm.

Care Quilts: Lucy Smith reported 272 Care Quilts were donated in 2015 to Phoebe's Home, Prenatal Clinic, St. Joseph Cancer Center, Hospice Brazos Valley, Texas Dept. of Child Protective Services, and Hope Pregnancy Center. Since 1996, we have donated 4,209 quilts.

Challenge Quilt: Nadine Stuth chose a Tropical Surprise theme using parrot fabric to make Challenge Quilts as care quilts to be entered at the mini Quilt Show this fall. Viewers' choice votes will select the top 3 quilts to be auctioned off. See Nadine for contest guidelines.

Habitat for Humanity: **Nancy Searcy** showed examples of Welcome wall hangings presented to Habitat families at dedications. She has instructions and 12 wall hangings available. If interested in presenting or making wall hangings, let Nancy know.

Newsletter: **Anne Perry** requested items for the newsletter by the 20th of the month, including photos of Show and Tell when she cannot be at the meetings. **Maggie McGuire** is co-editor. Anne thanked **Michaele Jackson** for all her work in years past.

Web site: **Chris Deppe** reported the web site is up to date, and photos will be added soon.

Quilt Education: Carol Willson reported we will be at Washington on the Brazos Mar. 5-6.

Summer Retreat: **Peggy Mobley** reported there is room for 24 members at the Magnolia Manor Retreat on June 23-26, cost is \$300, 4 persons per room, and sign up in February.

Winter Retreat: Diane Bullard reported 36 members are going to Camp Lone Star in La-Grange on Feb. 11-15. A supply list was handed out for one required activity. A 20% off coupon for All Around the Block Quilt Shop is good for the weekend.

Soldier Squares: Marian Dierschke reported that packets are available to make red, white and blue squares to send to soldiers. If you have names/addresses of soldiers, let her know.

Dallas Bus Trip: Jean Rierson reported this huge quilt show with lots of vendors and demos is Mar. 12. The \$50 for members and \$60 for non-members includes bus ride and ticket to the show. Bus leaves Wells Fargo Bank on Briarcrest at 7 am and arrives at 10 am. Leave to return at 4:30 with a stop in DeSoto for dinner and arrival at 9 pm. We need 53 people to sign up beginning this month so the guild does not have to subsidize the trip.

Programs: Melody Nelson requested sign-ups for "Barn Quilts" program in Feb. Fee includes treated wood and paint to create a painted quilt that hangs outdoors. Bring your own pattern for the 2'x2' project. www.countrylivingquilt.com has patterns and examples.

Old Business:

Donation Quilt: Sue Idol proposed naming a committee to schedule and set up the quilt to sell tickets. **JoAnn Williams** volunteered to schedule locations, while **Charles Gilreath**, **Michaele**continued on page 7

Jackson, Maggie McGuire, and **Kitty Art** volunteered to set up the quilt at guilds and public events. A sign-up sheet for the Antique Show at the Brazos Center on Feb 5-7 was circulated.

New Business:

St. Mary's Quilt Show: Sue introduced Lorraine Nelson who invited us to the free St. Mary's Quilt Show in Plantersville on April 29-30 in a historic painted church. Donated proceeds benefit St. Vincent de Paul. They need quilts to be entered, and guilds entering 15 or more quilts will be listed in the program. Entry forms are on their web site www.stmarysquiltshow.com; [specifically, it's http://www.stmarysquiltshow.com/quilt-entry-form.html] A Gala Preview with seated dinner is \$50 per person on April 28. They will have great vendors, lunch under the pavilion, and beautiful quilts.

2016 Budget: Benita Ebel, Treasurer, handed out the proposed 2016 budget, reflecting a \$9,470 income and \$15,870 outflow. The revenue from the 2015 Quilt Show covers budgeted expenses in 2016. Under Programs, the Dallas Bus Trip must break even, and the monthly workshops must fill up as they are already paid for. The Donation Quilt must make \$5,000. Insurance cost increased, and web site decreased. This is an Audit year. When funds or reimbursements are needed, let Benita know ASAP. Charles Gilbreath moved and Rosanne Coody seconded to approve the budget, motion passed.

Mug Rug Exchange: Maggie McGuire proposed a Mug Rug Exchange between the Caldwell Guild and BBQG in May. Each will share a recipe and short bio about the quilter with the mug rug. Participants will be added to the newsletter list from each guild and invited to workshops. Their guild meets the 4th Wed. of each month at the Methodist Church. This joint venture will increase participation for both guilds.

Sue Idol bought a combination lock for the storage locker after vandals tampered with the old lock. See Sue if you need to access locker. Volunteers are in the process of sorting items in the locker.


