If you have any other questions about it, just ask. I am happy to explain it.

So let's keep on quilting and sewing. Many are in need of what we do, including us.

Minutes for Brazos Bluebonnet Quilt Guild Tuesday, August 9, 2016

Welcome – **President Sue Idol** opened the meeting at 7 p.m. at the Brazos Center.

Treasurer's Report – Benita Ebel reported a balance of \$14,097.87 in the checking account and \$16,825.77 in the Savings account, making a total of \$30,923.64. She added that we have a goal of raising \$5,400 for the donation quilt, and need \$2,900

more in ticket sales by the end of the year to stay on budget. Scholarships need to be paid to this year's recipients.

Sunshine & Shadows – Mary Anne Durbin announced that she has a new grandson. Debbie Ginn also has a new grandson, and Deb DeRoche has a second granddaughter on the way.

Membership – **Nadine Stuth** reported that 60 members and three visitors attended, including Debby Walters, Susie Feldman, and Barbara Linick.

Door Prizes - Bunny Douglas, Joyce Blasi, Margie Williams, and Diane Gilliland won door prizes.

Minutes – Motion was made to accept the minutes by **Charles Gilreath** and seconded by **Peggy Leach**; minutes approved.

Arts Council – Mary Anne Durbin encouraged everyone to see Emily May's Experiential Art exhibit at the Arts Council until September 10, 2016.

New Business – Sue Idol awarded three free tickets to the Quilt Show in Canton to Angela Harrison.

Linda Bridges explained the duties of the Care Quilt Chairperson in an effort to recruit co-chairs. Stephanie Modrall and Nicole Pavel volunteered to co-chair the Care Quilts.

Challenge Quilts – Nadine Stuth encouraged members to enter Challenge Quilts at the mini Quilt Show on September 13 and announced the deadline to enter is 5:00 p.m. at the Brazos Center. Maggie McGuire reviewed the handout she developed about the September meeting events. JoAnn Williams reminded members that the Go Texan quilt entries had to be from Brazos County.
