Budget –

BBQG Meeting Minutes – January 2018

The meeting was called to order by president Maggie McGuire at 7:00 p.m. on January 9th at the Brazos Center. There were 58 in attendance, including five visitors.

Following brief discussion, a motion was made by Charles Gilreath, and seconded by Linda Bridges to approve the budget as submitted. The budget was approved.

Treasurer's Report –

Maggie McGuire stated that the treasurer's report will no longer be presented at future meetings, due to privacy concerns and the presence of visitors and speakers at meetings. Reports will be available to members through MyGrove.

Minutes – The December minutes were read by Lou Ellen Hassold. A motion was made by Charles Gilreath and seconded by Rozan Coody to approve the minutes as read. The minutes were approved.

Committee Reports:

Care Quilts – Nicole Pavel reported that 270 care quilts were given out in 2017, bringing the total donations for the guild since 1996 to 4,694. 316 quilts were received in 2017. In addition, 356 quilts were given to Books and a Blanket, and 18 Quilts of Valor were presented. The annual care quilt work day for the guild will be June 13th.

Scholarship – Chair Marty Fuller was not in attendance, but past president Charles Gilreath reported that 2 scholarships will be awarded to area graduating seniors again in 2018, and that the application is available on the guild web site.

Summer Retreat - Rowena Reed reported that the summer retreat will be held on June 21-24, at Magnolia Manor, and that the cost will be \$300. Sign ups will begin at the February guild meeting.

Winter Retreat - Connie Silber reported that the winter retreat, to be held in February at Camp Lone Star is full, but there is a waiting list available to those who are interested.

Programs - Sharon Braunagel will present February's program on Color and Design, followed by a Luminous Squares workshop on February 14th. March's program will feature Lois Hallock on Creating the Perfect Quilting Space, followed by her workshop on Quilt Studio Design. In April Carol Morrissey will be the featured artist. Sign up sheets are available prior to every guild meeting.

Newsletter - Bonnie Peirnot reminded everyone that the deadline for submitting items to the newsletter is the 20th of each month.

Dallas Bus Trip - The annual bus trip to the Dallas quilt show will be on March 10th. Linda Bridges asks that everyone arrive at the Wells Fargo parking lot by 6:45 am. Cost is \$50 for members, and \$60 for non-members. This includes admission to the show, snacks and water. The bus will stop for dinner on the way home and should return by about 9:00 pm.

Website - Chairperson Chris Deppe was unable to attend, but Maggie McGuire reported plans to update the website, and asked for feedback from members. Suggestions should be emailed to Maggie.

Brazos Center Window - Bunny Douglas reported that the display window at the Brazos Center is currently empty following recent renovations, but would soon feature quilts by Judy Beskow. If anyone is interested in having their quilts in future displays, they should contact Bunny.

Sunshine and Shadows - Ann Gilreath sends cards as needed on behalf of the guild. Please contact Ann by email (same address as Charles Gilreath) to have a card sent if you know of someone who should receive one.

Bee Keeper - Jane Riggs is beekeeper and reports updates from bees in the newsletter each month. Please let her know of activities and events from various guild bees. Maggie McGuire reported that the All American Bee will host the national sew in day for Quilts of Valor at the American Legion hall on 2/3, beginning at 9:00 am.

Habitat for Humanity - Sally Robinson is chair. Welcome banner quilts are presented to families who move into new homes via habitat. If anyone is interested in making a welcome banner, they should contact Sally for instructions.

Donation Quilt - Joann Williams is responsible for scheduling appearances for the 2018 donation

quilt, and providing tickets for sale. Janet Kirkpatrick, Kitty Ard, and Charles Gilreath have each volunteered to keep the quilt and coordinate getting it to venues for one quarter this year. All members are encouraged to sign up to sit with the quilt at appearances. This is a major source of revenue for the guild.

Quilt Education - Chair Carol Willson reports that guild members will participate in Texas Independence Day activities at Washington on The Brazos, and at Boonville Days this fall. Letters will be sent to area schools to remind them of education programs available through the guild.

PIPPS – Projects in Progress Previously Started. Chair Kerry Dwyer drew the number "5", as the project from participating member's lists, to finish for show and tell at the February meeting.

Arts Council – \$50 has been paid to the Arts Council for 2018. Another \$50 will be sent later in the year.

Mini Quilt Show – To be held in September to vote on Go Texan quilt, and to have challenge quilt show and auction. Marjean Neve reports that the 2018 theme for challenge entries is "What the Cluck?", and will feature chickens. The focus fabric is available, and is a chicken wire print.

Old Business:

Sixty blankets were given to the Bryan Police Department in December for distribution to the elderly.

All officer positions for 2019 have been filled. The secretary will be Janet Kirkpatrick.

New Business:

All receipts that are given to the treasurer for reimbursement must now be submitted through committee chairs.

A review of our outdated guild bylaws will be conducted this year. Denise Mackan, 2019 president elect, will oversee this effort.

PIPPS Challenge


(Projects In Progress Previously Started)


