It will be auctioned at their upcoming fundraiser. **Minutes** – A motion was made by Charles Gilreath and seconded by Paulette Mayes to approve the September minutes as published in the newsletter. The minutes were approved.

Old Business:

Mini Quilt Show – Marjean Neve reported that the mini quilt show was a success. Thirty quilts were entered and 76 people attended.

Boonville Days – Will be held the weekend of October 13th. Guild members will be on hand to do demonstrations and education.

.New Business:

Quilt Show – The quilt show committee will meet at 7pm on October 17th at the American Legion Hall. Debbie Brooks is requesting a co-chair for the vendors committee. There will be a new booth at the show called "Just Quilts". Maggie McGuire has donated a large number of vintage quilts for sale at this booth. In addition, members may donate additional quilts, or sell quilts on consignment.

Christmas Party – Maggie McGuire provided fliers for the Christmas party. The theme is Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairy. It will be held December 11th at 6:00pm. Ham and drinks will be provided. Everyone should bring a dish, \$20 gift for the exchange, and wear Christmas attire.

Donation Quilt – The donation quilt will be at the Brazos County Fair October 18-21, and at the Hempstead Quilt Show on October 27th. Volunteers are needed to sit with the quilt.

Programs - Sharon Braunagel showed us beautiful sample quilts for the November workshop, Scrappy Applique with Shannon Brinkley. Workshop signup sheets were passed around.

Speaker – Nancy Mahoney presented a lovely trunk show featuring her quilts.

Show and Tell – Guild members participated in Show and Tell, sharing a variety of beautiful quilts.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 pm.

22nd Annual BBQG Winter Retreat

Fall is finally here and it's time to start thinking about winter retreat! The 22nd Annual Winter Retreat will be held February 7-10, 2019 at Camp Lone Star in La Grange. If you would like to attend (and did not pre-register last spring), you may sign up for the winter retreat beginning at 6:30 p.m. on November 13, 2018 at the Brazos Center. The retreat is open to BBOG members only. The cost of the retreat is \$250 for 3 nights (Thursday, Friday) and Saturday). This cost includes meals and lodging. Nine spaces are left and once the retreat is full, a waiting list will be started to fill vacancies as they occur. You may register yourself and one other person. A \$50 non-refundable registration fee is required from each person you register. The balance will be due by the January BBQG meeting. You may also pay for the retreat in installments, but the final payment is due January 8,

2019 – no exceptions!! Also, please remember that all participants must have paid their 2019 BBQG annual dues before making final payment for the 2019 winter retreat.
