Quilt 'n Peace Bee met on December 4 at Martha's Bloomers for our Christmas social and the last meeting of the year. Currently there are 26 active members with a high attendance of 22 members, and average of 14. We contributed a total of 132 care quilts to the BBQG, Books and a Blanket, Children's Ward of Driscoll Hospital in Corpus Christi, and Brazos Council on the Aging. We also made four twin-sized quilts for high school graduates at Round Rock Baptist Children's Home, donated a raffle quilt to Phi Delta Kappa at Sam Houston State University in Huntsville that raised \$280.00, and made 23 bibs for adults in nursing homes for the Brazos Council on the Aging.
