 requirement is at least 42" x 42".

Quilts will be judged by viewers choice. Must complete entry process but no registration fee needed.

- Admission to the show \$10 general admission for both days; admission is free with military ID; children 12 and under also free.
- Go Texan Must comply with Go Texan rules. General rules are on the BBQG website


