The BBQG held their monthly meeting at the Brazos Center on May 14, 2019. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Denise Mackan. There were 70 members present and 4 visitors.

Minutes – A motion was made by Charles Gilreath and 2^{nd} by Sharon Braunagle to approve the April minutes as written in the newsletter. Minutes were approved.

Quilt Show Report – Maggie McGuire gave a summary of the Quilt Show Committee work. Members and bees were encouraged to provide a basket for the Basket Blitz and a page of basket ideas was distributed.. 
