The BBQG held their monthly meeting at the Brazos Center on June 11, 2019. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Denise Mackan. There were 73 members present, 1 new member, and 8 visitors.

Door Prizes – Sue Ryan presented door prizes to Sally Robinson, Bunny Douglas, and Connie Harrison. The door prizes were graciously donated by our program speaker Debbie Jones.

Minutes – A motion was made by Charles Gilreath and 2nd by Linda Winder to approve the May minutes as written in the newsletter. Minutes were approved.

Quilt Show Report – Maggie McGuire gave a summary of the Quilt Show Committee work. Signup sheets were posted around the room listing different opportunities for members to volunteer to work at the show. Workers will be asked to wear a hat at the show to coordinate with our Garden Party theme. Maggie discussed a new booth, Quilts for Sale, in which members may sell their quilts on consignment. A billboard advertising the show will be up a month before the show. The company making the billboard, Lamar Advertising, is donating part of the cost and the local Go Texan Committee is donating \$250 to cover the remaining cost. The Bluebonnet Store still needs items to be sold in the booth, particularly new quilts or baby blankets, kitchen towels, pot holders, etc....
