October 2019 Meeting Minutes....

The BBQG held their monthly meeting at the Brazos Center on October 8, 2019. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Denise Mackan. There were 65 members present, 6 visitors, and 1 new member. The guild currently has 147 members.

Minutes – A motion was made by Connie Silber and 2nd by Rozan Coody to approve the September minutes as written in the newsletter. Minutes were approved.

Door Prizes – Sue Ryan presented door prizes to Vicki Carpenter and Rhonda Kuboviak.

Nominating Committee – Denise Mackan reported the nominating committee of Nancy Searcy, Rhonda Kuboviak, and herself were still looking for members to fill some key positions for the 2020 board. Positions filled are President – Denise Mackan; Treasurer – Susan Beasley; Membership – Nelda Cohan and Kitty Ard; Programs – Laura North. We are still looking for a President-Elect for 2021.

Christmas Party Committee – Donna Bracewell gave a brief report on activities planned for the party. Members who wish to participate in the gift exchange are to bring a sewing related gift of \$15-\$20. Members are to also bring a dish to share for the meal. Sign up will be available at the

November meeting. Janet Kirkpatrick suggested members bring a canned good donation or cash donation for the Brazos Valley Food Bank. Janet and Susan Payne volunteered to collect the donations at the party and deliver to the food bank.

Quilt Show Report – Rozan Coody and Benita Ebel gave a brief financial overview of the Quilt Show. Benita prepared a comparison of the proceeds from the 2017 show to the 2019 show. The 2019 show proceeds were 61% higher than the 2017 show. The detailed comparison will be posted on Groupworks for members to review. Connie Silber read a thank you note received from our Quilt Show judge and Judy Beskow mentioned we had also received a thank you note from our appraiser.

Donation Quilt – We still need a chairman for this committee. The responsibilities are to maintain the location of the quilt, schedule places for the quilt to go, and make sure the quilt gets to the next caretaker who is taking the quilt to sell tickets.

New Business

Arts Council – Nancy Searcy asked for items for the Display Case at the Arts Council. The Arts Council has also requested a donation quilt for their Boots and BBQ fundraiser.

QOV – Marjean Neve reported they are still meeting. Meetings are the 2nd and 4th Mondays of the month at the American Legion Hall. The QOV National Sew In Day will be held Saturday, February 1st. More information will be coming.

Programs – Sharon Braunagle announced our program for November, Round Robin Quilts, would not have a sign up and there is no charge for the workshop. Members were encouraged to form groups to make a round robin quilt that will be incorporated in another program in the future.


