Important Message From Denise Mackan, President, and Laura North, Program Chair

We have an exciting line-up of programs ahead of us this year: thank you Sharon Braunagel! Since both the February and March workshops are now full, this is a good time to establish a clear policy about how programs will be managed.

Participants may sign-up without paying, but it is expected that a check will follow. We all have busy lives; delays are totally understandable, but nonpayment becomes an issue when the workshop is full--it is only fair to those that are being turned away to ask for a commitment. By the same token, if you sign up and then need to cancel, please contact the Program Chair as soon as possible so others will have an opportunity to take your place. Please be as considerate as you would want others to be of you.

If you send something to the Program Chair (whether by mail or email), receipt will ALWAYS be acknowledged. If you do not get a response, you need to follow-up; do not "assume" anything.

Members of the Guild will ALWAYS have a limited opportunity to sign up for workshops before we open these opportunities to participants who are not members. There is a long history of half-filled workshops that turned out to be a significant financial burden for the Guild. Opening workshops to nonmembers is a good thing: not only does it ease the Guild's financial burden, these additional resources allow the Guild to offer more learning

opportunities. This practice also provides the potential of enhancing our membership. Most important: remember "Education" is our mission as a nonprofit organization. If we want to maintain our nonprofit status, the Guild is obligated to offer opportunities for everyone to learn, not just the members. In fairness to the membership, however, nonmembers will be charged more than members in the future.

Lastly, we strongly encourage all members to learn to navigate Groupworks, because it is the ONLY way the Guild can keep the members informed between meetings. 

BEE News...

It's a slow news month for Bee News but a few bees did check in with this beekeeper.

Happy Scrappers had a Christmas party where, instead of exchanging gifts among friends, we each brought a toy to be donated to a local charity. Judy B and her husband took the toys to Scotty's House, and they were so happy to receive them. Some of the toys will replace some worn-out toys in their playroom. Others will be given to children at the home, or shared with other local charities.



Quilt in Peace tallied our group efforts for last year.

We have 30 active members, with an average of 15 for the 44 times we met during 2019. High attendance was 23 and low was 5 with a total of 2,040 hours spent at the church.

There are seven members who either have long arm quilting machines or do machine quilting so none of those hours are included. The following summarizes QnP's contributions during the year:

- 165 Care quilts (approximately 40x45 inches)
- 3 Twin-sized quilts for students who lived at Texas Baptist Children's Home in Round Rock that graduated from high school
- 320 Soldier Squares
- 32 Christmas lap quilts and toiletries given to Brazos Council on the Aging (Included in #1);
- Finished 6 quilts (added borders, machine quilted, and bound, hand hemmed) for a bee member who passed away in April.

We are busy already this year with a goal to surpass these numbers. There is always room for others so join us at 9:30 each <u>Tuesday.at</u> First Baptist Church in College Station.

Material Girls are mostly planning and getting ready for winter retreat. Working on charity quilts or our own challenges. Our own Dottie Wilson lost her son so sadness has been there. We try to support as best we can.
