# March 2020 Meeting Minutes....

The BBQG held their monthly meeting at the Brazos Center on March 10, 2020. The meeting

was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Denise Mackan. There were 66 members, 1 new member, and 6 visitors present.

**Minutes** – A motion was made by Kerry Dwyer and  $2^{nd}$  by Sharon Braunagle to approve the February 2020 minutes as written in the newsletter. Minutes were approved.

**Door Prizes** – Sue Ryan distributed door prizes to Jane Riggs, Kerry Fisher, and Pat Patterson.

### **Old Business:**

**Budget** – Denise Mackan distributed the 2020 Guild Budget and announced the budget was posted online in Groupworks. Denise reminded the membership the budget is an estimate of income/expense for the year and every place possible, expenses would be minimized. Any area where expenses exceed what is estimated would usually require an explanation of reasons they were more than expected. After discussion of current bylaw procedure which does not indicate the budget must be voted on by membership, Linda Bridges made a motion to amend the current bylaws to state membership vote and approval of budget would be required. Sue Idol  $2^{nd}$  the motion. Motion passed. Linda Bridges and Jane Crouse volunteered to form a committee to make the change to the bylaws.

**Raffle Quilt** – The 2020 Raffle quilt has visited several venues. At the Kingwood Guild, \$80 in ticket sales was collected, Woodlands Guild, \$61 was collected, Go Texan, \$100+, and Washington on the Brazos netted approximately \$272 in ticket sales.

**Standing Committees** – Denise Mackan reminded the guild we have many standing committees and all are volunteer based. Many have stepped up to work on these committees. Remember to show appreciation for the work they do. If you are interested in volunteering on any committee, please let Denise or someone on the committee know. We all need to participate to continue making our Guild the best possible.

## New Business:

**Mini Quilt Show** – Members were reminded our Theme for the Mini Quilt Show is "Log Cabin". Our Go Texan Quilt will also be chosen that night. Laura North announced we would be having a member "Yard Sale" at the show where members rent a table and sell items from their sewing/quilting collection they no longer need or want (tools, fabric, etc...). The date of the Mini Quilt Show is September 8<sup>th</sup>.

**Brazos Valley Fair and Rodeo** – Denise Mackan reminded members of the Brazos Valley Fair and Rodeo, October  $17^{\text{th}} - 25^{\text{th}}$ , 2020. The Fair has a quilt show and members were encouraged to enter their quilts. Rules and entry forms can be found on the Brazos Valley Fair and Rodeo webpage later this Spring.

**2021 Quilt Show** – Laura North and Debbie Brooks have volunteered to Co-Chair the 2021 Quilt Show.

In the Event of Meeting Cancelation – Denise Mackan briefed the membership of board discussion on procedures they would follow to notify membership in the event a Guild Meeting had to be cancelled. The board discussed utilizing Groupworks, Brazoshealth.org, Public Service announcements on KBTX, our Facebook Page, and developing a phone tree. If a meeting is cancelled, we will try to make sure an announcement is posted as soon as possible on as many venues as we can.

**Programs** – Laura North gave an update on future workshops. Tonight is the last night to register for Norma Reel's workshop, "Wonder Flutters". Cost for Norma's workshop is \$35 plus \$25 for the ruler.
