From the President...

Hi All,

For this resolution I'll have to sew and quilt more, and look at television or Facebook less. Yes, I know this is not a new idea by any stretch of the imagination. However, one day in the months ahead, we will be free to travel, visit with family, and get together with all our quilting community members again without the fear of getting sick. That's the time to give quilts we've completed, along with a great big hug, to family and friends!

And don't forget about a future BBQG quilt show! Our next quilt show is in the works, but a timeline will not be scheduled or posted until we feel it is safe to hold this event. When that time comes, wouldn't it be nice if you already had that special quilt waiting to be entered rather than thinking, "Oh gosh! I have to hurry and finish this beauty, so I can enter it in time!" I have a quilt top in mind that has been *complaining* to me for a few years, "Please quilt me!" I guess I'll have to put that on my list of 10 projects! And while I'm writing about our quilting community getting together again, I want to make sure all members are aware that the board is considering, and has approached guild members on GroupWorks, about a move of venue for the physical guild meetings. (I have posted a Poll on GroupWorks that allows you to share your opinion.) If you have not been on GroupWorks lately, (and you can access it), you can choose between two venues. The Brazos Center or the American Legion Post 159. Please read the advantages for the suggested change before you take the Poll.

If you cannot access GroupWorks then consider the benefits listed below, and if you'd like, you can voice your opinion to me via email, phone call, or mail.

- 1. There are no stairs to negotiate for members.
- 2. Meeting room is much larger, and there is room for mingling.
- 3. There are multiple tables available if needed.
- 4. Meeting room has a kitchen and raised stage for presenters.
- 5. Much shorter walk from the parking lot to the building.
- 6. Includes a portico attached to the building for rain issues.
- 7. Restrooms are closer to the meeting room.
- 8. It is easier to schedule permanent meeting dates without the issue of being bumped for other events.
- 9. Cost of American Legion Post is significantly less. The American Legion

Hall costs \$100.00 a month and includes a kitchen, tables and chairs, and a stage. The Brazos Center costs \$250.00 a month, or \$400.00 with a kitchen. That is a savings of \$2,400 a year for the guild

- 10. Distance from the Brazos Center is only 3.8 miles 8 minutes, but it may be closer for some members
- 11. We are supporting another nonprofit, and that money can be used to support their members.

Many of you have attended workshops here, so you know the building is nice and clean. We would schedule the largest room in the building with the stage and kitchen. The only possible issue we can see is that would have to *shift our meeting day from the second Tuesday to the second*

Thursday (Tuesday has been reserved for the Boy Scouts for years). Hopefully this is not a problem for most of you, and may even work out better for some.

The BBQG held their January monthly meeting virtually via Zoom on January 12, 2021. The meeting began at 6:30 p.m. and was attended by 35 members.

Treasurer's Report: The 2021 budget prepared by Susan Beasley was presented to the guild members to review. There was a question about the fact that the budget is unbalanced. It was explained that it usually is unbalanced in the year when a quilt show is not held. Additionally, this last year with COVID has been difficult to recruit attendees for the zoom workshops. Donna Bracewell asked for a motion to approve. The first motion was made by Marjorie Williams and a second motion was made by Mary Anne Durbin.

Raffle Quilt: Laura North presented information of the raffle quilt for 2021. It is a Round Robin quilt and is scheduled to be quilted in June 2021. Once it is completed, raffle tickets can then be sold. Janet Kirkpatrick is the coordinator for the Raffle Quilt 2022. She will be recruiting volunteers and if interested, she can be reached by email at jk.quilting81@gmail.com.

Programs: There are not any physical program meetings planned at this time. Laura has posted on GroupWorks the programs scheduled through June 2021. In addition to the programs listed, there may be a Fall celebration in which the members will be able to physically gather together. Additionally, it is hoped that a Christmas Party can be planned.

Denise Mackan has volunteered to be program chairman for 2022.

Venue Change Proposed: The Board has proposed to change the Guild meeting place from the Brazos Center to the American Legion Post. The pros and cons were discussed by the attendees. A poll has been placed on GroupWorks for all members to express their opinion on this change. If the meeting location is changed, then the meeting time and place will also be changed to the second Thursday of the month at 6:30 pm.

Scholarships: JoAnn Williams will be reviewing applications from students for the 2021 scholarships. Nancy Searcy has donated two quilts for the scholarship winners.

Care Quilts: Rachelle Kubricht delivered 29 quilts to the Prenatal Clinic and 29 quilts to a Hospice Group. She is trying to deliver quilts every other month.

Prizes: Sue Ryan is collecting items to be used for door prizes which will be used when the physical meetings start again. Think of this when you are cleaning out your supplies and donate what you don't need.

Zoom Meetings: A Zoom bee will be starting in February on the third Thursday of the month at 6:30 p.m. Initially, there will be an organizing and planning session to find out what members might be interested in. Everyone is invited and they can work on whatever project they want.

Show and Tell: There were no quilts or projects submitted to Sue Chrysler this month for Show and Tell.

GroupWorks: Sue Chrysler presented an informal tutorial about GroupWorks for those who were interested in staying after the meeting. She may also plan another tutorial on this same topic in the future and will coordinate with Laura North to schedule this. The meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
