# **BBQG Meeting Minutes**

The BBQG meeting was held by Zoom with 40 participants. The meeting started at 6:36 pm on February 9, 2021.

The meeting was called to order by Donna Bracewell, President. She requested approval of the January 2021 meeting minutes. Janet Kirkpatrick motioned to approve the minutes. The motion was  $2^{nd}$  by Susan Beasley and the minutes were approved.

The Treasurer's report was given by Susan Beasley. A motion to approve the report was made by Marjean Neve and it was  $2^{nd}$  by Rachelle Kubricht. The report was approved.

Nelda Cohan, Membership Chair reported that there have been 41 new renewals, and 2 new members. She requested that <u>all</u> members complete a membership form and send with their check of \$35.00 by March 31,2021. By completing a membership form, it will help maintain an accurate roster of members and their information along with information on those individuals greater than 80 that do not pay dues. The mailing address is P.O. Box 9497, College Station, Texas 77842. The membership form and the mailing address is also located on the first page of the website, <u>www.BBQG.org.</u> Donna will also post this information on GroupWorks.

New Business:

- The proposal to change the meeting location passed by 41 members for and 9 members against. The new location will be at the American Legion Post on Hwy 21. Meetings will not begin there until the guild resumes physical meetings later in the year. American Legion has approved the Guild for meeting there. Marjean Neve will let them know it will be later in the year when the meetings start. The decision when to begin physical meetings will depend on the COVID 19 status and the vaccination program. Nancy Searcy asked if there were any penalties from The Brazos Center for changing our location. They have refunded everything from March 2020 to the present.
- Nancy Searcy is the new Beekeeper. Chris Deppe will forward to Nancy a list of all the BBQG bees. Nancy will visit each guild over the next few months and submit a report about each of the Bee's activities to the board and also to Chris so it can be posted on the website.
- Care Quilts: Rachelle Kubricht recently dropped off 20 quilts to the Prenatal Clinic. She requested that drop off locations for the Care Quilts be posted on the guild's Facebook page.
- If tags are needed for quilts, notify Rachelle as they need to be approved by the Guild. Marjean Neve made a motion to order more tags, and Nancy Searcy 2<sup>nd</sup> it. Tags can be distributed by Nancy as she is visiting the Bees.The raffle quilt for 2021-2022 for has been chosen and is a Western Motif Block

of the Month kit that was donated by Susan Beasley. Janet Kirkpatrick will chair the quilt but she is not making it. Janet presented a power point showing each block of the month and asking members to volunteer for making each block. The quilt blocks need to be ready for quilt construction by June 2021. Norma Reel will begin quilting in September 2021.

The business meeting and guest lecture will continue be on the second Tuesday of the month as long as meetings are Zoomed. When physical meetings start again, they will be on the second Thursday of the month. Workshops are planned for Saturdays after the guest lecture. Laura North is hoping that there will be a "Reunion Party" held in the fall that all members can attend in person. Denise Mackan, as new program chair for 2022, has been working hard to arrange a program schedule for next year. Hopefully, all of these meetings will be physical and not zoomed.

Marjean Neve reviewed the Quilts of Valor Sew-In that was held on February 6 at the American Legion Post. 19 participants contributed to making 9 quilts. Two were completed on February 6 and the others will be completed at the Quilts of Valor Bee held every 2 weeks on Monday.

Donna Bracewell suggested a new idea for a segment of the meetings: "Parade of Quilt rooms."

She presented a power point on her personal Quilt Room. She included slides on how her room was organized, utilization of space, and organization of supplies. She suggested that other members take pictures of their rooms and present them at the meeting.

Update on Friendship Block: The deadline for entering your block(s) is at the next guild meeting on March 9<sup>th</sup>. Please submit a picture of your block(s) to Donna Bracewell prior to the meeting. Text or email Donna so she can have a ticket for you. A drawing will be held and the winner will receive 12 completed blocks to finish a quilt of her own. If there are enough blocks for 2 quilts to be made, a second winner will be announced. For any questions regarding friendship quilt, the information is on QuiltWorks.

Show and Tell: Sue Chrysler's slide show presented a number of quilts made by members Kay Fitzpatrick Simmons, Jeanie Bassett, Donna Bracewell, Nancy Searcy, Janet Kirkpatrick, and Rowena Reed. The President's quilt made by Maggie McGuire and presented to Denise Mackan was also shown.
